March 18, 2024 Special Meeting Re: Solar

The City received 7 proposals for solar installations at the following facilities: Police Station, Library, DPW garage and the water building. Proposals also include an EV charging station in the police station and updated inverters at city hall.

One of the proposals was incomplete and could not be evaluated.

The city's process for evaluating proposals is as follows: each committee member rates (not ranks) each proposal on a scale of 1-5 using the criteria, other than the cost criteria, that was provided to the vendors. (see attached for criteria). The cost information will be provided at the meeting, after the committee has evaluated the "soft" criteria.

Vendors were asked to provide costs for three alternatives: 1) a second EV charging station at the PD, 2) a rapid shut down control at City Hall to address electrical code upgrades, and 3) more robust monitoring to provide better data about the performance of the solar and energy consumption at the facilities. The Committee will have to decide which of these alternates to accept. Staff is recommending the city accept all three for the following reasons:

- The monitoring and consumption data will provide more complete information that will be useful in making further energy upgrades in the future.
- To replace the inverters for the existing array at City Hall requires updated electrical equipment for current electrical code compliance.
- Adding a second charging station at the PD in the future will be significantly more expensive.
- It is possible to complete all the work for approximately \$200,000 with the alternates, which is well within the available ARPA funding.

The proposals received are very diverse making comparison difficult and some of the information is technical so, the city will rely on the expertise of our consultant Upper90. Staff offers the following summary of the proposals:
