Mayor Christopher Lund called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.

Others Present: City Administrator Ramona Flanigan, City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Hegglund, Municipal Services Director Howard Moser, Police Chief Robert Kowalski City Attorney Bill Morgan, and a few citizens.

Hegglund confirmed the meeting agendas were properly posted on Friday, July 30, 2021 at the Post Office, Edgerton Library, City website, and City Hall.

ACCEPT THE AGENDA: A Candy Davis/Paul Davis motion to accept the agenda as printed passed. All voted in favor.

PUBLIC HEARING: The Council held a public hearing to hear comments regarding special assessments for the Dairyland Drive street, stormsewer, and sidewalk construction.

Jennifer Janecek stated her husband owns one of the lots that will be assessed for this improvement and she feels it is a big assessment. She stated they have been trying to sell the land and have not been successful. If they are assessed another \$60,000, they may not be able to recoup the cost from the sale. She also feels the improvements being made will not benefit them.

Hearing no further comments Mayor Christopher Lund closed the public hearing.

RESOLUTION 16-21: Candy Davis/Sarah Braun moved to adopt City of Edgerton Resolution 16-21: Preliminary resolution declaring the City Council's intentions for the Dairyland Drive extension to exercise special assessment police powers.

Jim Burdick/Paul Davis moved to amend Resolution 16-21 by adding a 5-year deferral with no interest or payment due; then a 10-yr amortization at 2% interest rate and payment in full upon request for access to the street, sewer services, or water services. Mayor Christopher Lund called the meeting to order for the City Council at 6:07 p.m.

Commission Chair Christopher Lund called the meeting to order for the Plan Commission at 6:07 p.m.

Present: Chris Lund, Jim Burdick, Paul Davis, Theran Springstead, Jim Kapellen, Julie Hagemann, and Ron Webb.

Others Present: City Administrator Ramona Flanigan, City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Hegglund and a few citizens.

Hegglund confirmed the meeting agendas were properly posted on Friday, August 6, 2021 at the Post Office, City Hall, City website, and the Edgerton Library.

PUBLIC HEARING: The Council and Plan Commission held a public hearing to gather public input on the request by Ilir Banushi to amend the City of Edgerton Comprehensive Plan for a portion of the unplatted area north of Brailsford Junction Way and west of Dairyland Drive by changing the land use designation from Community Commercial (Planned Business in the 2015 Plan) to Mixed Residential (Multifamily in the 2015 Plan).

City Administrator Ramona Flanigan stated the land use designation is based on the 2007 North Gateway Neighborhood Development Plan which was also part of the 2015 adoption.

The proposed amendment shifts the boundary between residential land uses and commercial land uses west, thus reducing the amount of planned commercial area and increasing the amount of residential area in the neighborhood. At the time of creation of the Neighborhood Plan, the demand for "brick-and-mortar" commercial space was greater than it is today. For this reason, staff recommends the City approve the proposed amendment.

Pete Weston, design engineer for the petitioner, stated he is available for any questions.

Anette Murwin, 54 US Hwy 51, stated she is present to find out what type of development is being proposed, who it will be marketed to, and what quality of development it will be.

Julie Olson, 34 US Hwy 51, stated they have a fully functioning farm right next to this property. She would like to know what the plans are for stormwater, parking, and green space.

Tim Krause, 34 US Hwy 51, he also asked where the stormwater will be going.

City Administrator Ramona Flanigan informed the attendees that this specific public hearing is for amending the Comprehensive Plan, not the development plan. There is a second public hearing

tonight, after this meeting, that will address the development and many of the questions that have been asked.

Hearing no further comments, the Mayor closed the public hearing.

Application for a Facade Grant for 11 Henry St: The owners of 11 Henry Street (C&M Printing) are requesting approval of a façade grant to repair stucco on the building. The one bid is for \$2,200. The Historic Commission Chair has approved the color. The Supersized 50% facade grant amount would be \$1,100.

Application for Facade Grant for 102 W Fulton St: The owners of 102 W Fulton Street (C&M Printing) are requesting approval of a façade grant for tuckpointing the chimney. The one bid is for \$6,300. The Supersized 50% facade grant amount would be \$3,150.

Application for Facade Grant for 102 and 104 W Fulton St: The owners of 102 and 104 W Fulton Street (C&M Printing) are requesting approval of a façade grant to replace 2 upper floor windows that face Henry Street and one ground floor, storefront window (104 W Fulton). The upper windows will fill the brick openings and will appear as if they are double hung. The lower window will be the same size as the existing window. The trim will be the same color as the existing trim and has been approved by the Historic Commission Chair. The one bid is for \$3,410. The Supersized 50% facade grant amount would be \$1,705.

Revive Edgerton Bid Policy: The program policy requires applicants provide at least two bids. While we will still recommend applicants have two bids, it is very difficult to obtain bids for some work and the two-bid requirement may dissuade people from applying.

ORDINANCE NO. 21-08 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN OF THE CITY OF EDGERTON, WISCONSIN

The City Council of the City of Edgerton, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to sections 62.23(2) and (3) and 66.1001 of Wisconsin Statutes, the City of Edgerton is authorized to prepare, adopt, and amend a comprehensive plan as defined in sections 66.1001(1)(a) and 66.1001(2) of Wisconsin Statutes.

SECTION 2. The City Council of the City of Edgerton has adopted and followed written procedures designed to foster public participation in every stage of the preparation of its comprehensive plan amendment as required by section 66.1001(4)(a) of Wisconsin Statutes.

SECTION 3. The City of Edgerton has held at least one public hearing on this ordinance, in compliance with the requirements of section 66.1001(4)(d) of Wisconsin Statutes and provided other opportunities for public involvement per its adopted public participation strategy and procedures.

SECTION 4. The proposed amendment to the Comprehensive Plan is to change the land use designation from Community Commercial (Planned Business in the 2015 Plan) to Mixed Residential (Multifamily in the 2015 Plan) for the unplatted area north of Brailsford Junction Way and west of Dairyland Drive in accordance with the attached map.

SECTION 5. The Plan Commission of the City of Edgerton, by a majority vote of the entire Commission recorded in its official minutes, has adopted a resolution recommending to the City Council the adoption of the amendment to the "City of Edgerton Comprehensive Plan," containing all of the elements specified in section 66.1001(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes.

SECTION 6. The City Council of the City of Edgerton, Wisconsin, does, by enactment of this ordinance, formally adopt the amendment to the document entitled, "City of Edgerton Comprehensive Plan," pursuant to section 66.1001(4)(c) of Wisconsin Statutes.

SECTION 7. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage by a majority vote of the members-elect of the City Council and publication/posting as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 22.503(1) "SIGN PROHIBITIONS AND LIMITATIONS" OF CHAPTER 22 "ZONING ORDINANCES" TO REDUCE THE DURATION OF AN IMAGE/TEXT ON MESSAGE CENTER SIGNS, IN THE CODE OF ZONING ORDINANCES, CITY OF EDGERTON ROCK AND DANE COUNTIES, WISCONSIN

Alderperson introduced the following Ordinance and moved its adoption:
THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EDGERTON, ROCK AND DANE COUNTIES, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:
Chapter 22 sections 22.503(1) shall be amended as follows:
22.503 (1) Sign Prohibitions and Limitations. (c) No illuminated flashing signs or chasing lights shall be permitted. Flashing signs are those that change their appearance more than once every thirty (30) sixty (60) seconds. Electronic message center (EMC) including video screen signs are permitted in the B-1 Local Business District and in any residential district for Indoor Institutional land uses with a conditional use permit; and in the B-3 Large Scale Commercial District, the B-4 Suburban Commercial District, and the M-1 Light Industrial District as a special use under the following conditions: the sign does not change its appearance more than once every thirty (30) sixty (60) or more seconds; the sign contains no chasing lights; the sign message does not advertise an off premises business; when located in a residential zoning district or visible from a residential unit, the EMC shall not be illuminated between 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.; the EMC utilizes an auto-dimming feature to adjust the brightness of the display based on ambient outside light; the EMC is equipped with a manual and scheduled brightness control so that the brightness of the sign does not negatively impact adjoining properties; and the sign is not incandescent bulbs or rotating louvers. Electronic message center and video signs shall be considered part of the total sign area allowed (except in the case of a community information sign).
This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and publication.

Staff has reviewed the petition for planning issues in accordance with the <u>Edgerton Master Plan</u> and has the following comments:


- 1. The proposed land division is within the City of Edgerton's extraterritorial zone. Therefore, the City has land division review authority.
- 2. The petitioner proposes to create one additional lot for development. This lot already contain a single-family house in a developed area in the Town of Albion. This parcel is very close to the City boundary, which is concerning in that development in the Town near the City border could inhibit logical City Expansion. The City cannot however, provide sanitary sewer service to the proposed lot making it unlikely that the owner would pursue annexation into the City. Dane County will prohibit the further development of the parcel with a deed restriction through their Transfer of Development Rights Program.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Plan Commission recommend the City Council approve the proposed land division.




