Arboretum Noun: ar·bo·re·tum

Definition of Arboretum: a place where trees, shrubs, and herbaceous plants are cultivated for scientific and educational purposes

The Edgerton Tree Board has initiated a multi-year project that will result in the establishment of a "linear arboretum" in Racetrack Park. The project will entail planting a line of various tree types around the outfield fences of the baseball field complex. The trees will be grouped to allow comparisons. For example, tree groupings might include trees for wet soils, woodland trees of Wisconsin, evergreens, and small trees suitable for beneath power lines. By organizing the trees in this way, we have the best chance of providing useful information to citizens about tree diversity, thus encouraging greater diversification of our urban forest.


The goals of the linear arboretum are several:

- to demonstrate to the public that there are many interesting tree types that thrive in Wisconsin;
- to allow residents to compare and contrast the different tree types by having them in one area;
- to bring attention to the importance of trees to the environment and to our community; and
- to show how different trees can have different functional purposes (screens, shade, windbreak, etc.).

The **linear arboretum** will provide a place for residents to establish a tree to memorialize or honor anything of importance. A tree could honor someone, something, or an event: a tree could commemorate a wedding anniversary, the birth of a child, an important event in history, a pet. Memorial trees will comprise the part of the linear arboretum nearest the entrance to Racetrack Park so as to be convenient for visitors.




Brush Pickup

Brush pickup is scheduled for the first Tuesday of the month through November, weather permitting. Limbs and branches should be piled or put in gar-

bage cans. Piles should be no larger than 6 feet long and 24 inches in diameter. Garbage cans should not exceed 100 pounds. Residents may bring bushes, tree limbs and other brush to the city owned dump site located in the back of the Fassett Cemetery. Fassett Cemetery Flowers & Plants

All winter flowers and hanging baskets must be removed by November 1st of each year or they will be removed and disposed of by cemetery personnel. Holiday flowers can be placed on or after November 11.

Winter Parking Rules

Winter snow parking regulations will go into effect on November 1, 2018. Parking is not allowed on any street or highway after a snowfall until snow is plowed back to the curb. Overnight parking in parking lots is restricted to the rear of the lots during any snowfall as posted in all lots. Parking on unplowed streets will result in a fine of \$50.00.

Sidewalks

Please have your sidewalks cleared from edge to edge of all snow and ice no later than 24 hours after a snowfall. Failure to clear walks in the appropriate time may result in a fine of \$25.00-\$200.00.

Snow Plowing

It is against city ordinance to plow snow from your personal driveway, sidewalk, or parking area into public streets or alleys. If necessary the City will remove the snow that was put in the public street and the cost of the snow removal will be charged to the property owner in addition to a potential fine of \$25-\$200.

Are you Registered? Check myvote.wi.gov to make sure you have an active registration, your name and address are correct, and you know your voting location. You may also register on that website.

Research the four referendum questions prior to voting. The ballots and explanation notices for the referendum questions can be found on the City's website: www.cityofedgerton.com

Remember to bring a photo ID (with your current name) to the polling place. If you do not have a photo ID, the Dept of Motor Vehicles can issue one.
