**CONSTRUCTION EXTENSION FOR GRACEFUL LLC FOR MARSHVIEW CT LOT:** Josh Stone, the owner of Graceful LLC requested another extension to the construction requirement deadline. The previous extension gave Mr. Stone until July 14, 2023 to commence construction. He will not meet that deadline. Mr. Stone stated some progress has been made. He has already brought in 200 tons of fill and is almost to grade. He predicts he needs about 1 more foot of fill. Flanigan stated the requirement for fill was not imposed by the city. This was a requirement assumed by the Mr. Stone. At this time there has been no site plan drawn nor an engineer engaged to move the project forward.

He stated he has the funds for the minimum 4,000 sf building but is considering a bigger building if he can get investors. He would like to build a bigger building and rent out a portion of it.

He is asking for an additional 60 days to commence construction. Flanigan stated the Plan Commission would have to approve any site plans, therefore, the 60 day deadline may be unattainable. He stated the 60 days would still be close but he is confident he can meet the deadline.

Many Council members stated, more stuff has been moved and stored on the property and they have not seen much progress in getting the land ready to build. They felt after the previous 6 months extension was given, there has not been significant progress made.

A Candy Davis/Shawn Prebil motion to give the owner of Graceful LLC until August 7, 2023 to provide a construction schedule and evidence of contracts to build the building passed on a 4/1 roll call vote. Casey Langan voted against the motion.

**CLOSED SESSION:** Casey Langan/Candy Davis moved to go into closed session pursuant to Wis. Stat. 1985(1)(e) "Deliberating or negotiating the purchasing of public properties, the investing of public funds, or conducting other specified public business whenever competitive or bargaining reasons require a closed session." Discuss and consider public utility extension and land purchase. The motion passed on a 5/0 roll call vote.

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**Parking at Racetrack Park:** If the Council wishes to proceed with the paving the new parking area at Racetrack Park, the Council could consider the attached quote in the amount of \$22,762 from Rock Road. The price is the same unit cost as the bid price for Quigley St which was competitively bid.

The cost already incurred for the installation of the gravel base for the parking lot is \$12,024. Funds for this project could come from impact fees (balance is \$92,644); capital surplus funds (balance is \$274,852); or \$7,500 that is reserved in the General Fund for the soccer field. At least \$12,202 of impact fees should be spent by the end of this year on eligible expenses as these funds have a time limit on being expended.

**Sidewalk at dance floor:** The Rotary Club will make improvements to the seating in the dance floor area this fall. The plan calls for the removal of the fence at the top of the dance floor area and the addition of a concrete "sidewalk" as a safety measure to let pedestrians know that there is a grade change. The cost of the sidewalk is estimated to be \$3,924. Funding for the improvement could come from park impact fees or from reserved funds for the Racetrack Park entrance project.

## **Ordinance changes and resolutions related to fees and fines:**

**Res 22-23:** As noted in previous staff reports, the updated code removes fees from the ordinance and puts them in a fee schedule. The only fees that are recommended to be changed are highlighted or struck through. The proposed fee changes relate to permits issued by staff, not the building inspector. The reason for the changes are to better equate the cost of the permit with the amount of staff time needed for the type of permit.

**Res 23-23 Bond Schedule:** The new code also updates several fines. The Chief of Police and the Municipal Judge reviewed the fine and forfeitures as part of the recodification. This bond schedule updates the 2014 bond schedule. Fines listed in the 2014 schedule are

noted in the margin. If that is nothing noted from the 2014 schedule, it means it was not on the schedule but was, and still is, in the ordinance.

**Ordinance 23-17:** eliminates the requirement for a fee charged by the Fire Chief for a second inspection.

**Ordinance 23-18:** Section 345-7 eliminates the permit for opening a street and changes responsibility for granting permission to open a street from the City Council to the Public Works Director. Section 345-30 removes the fee for permission to temporarily encumber a street with items such as construction materials and gives authority to grant permission to the Public Works Director as opposed to the City Council.

**Ordinance 23-12:** adds a penalty section to the newly created noise chapter.

**Other Ordinance changes:**

**Ordinance 23-15:** relates to changes brought on by the creation of the sidewalk utility and new curb policy. The amendment to Section 55-20 Special Assessments removes the requirement that sidewalk repair and replacement is funded through special assessments; modifies the driveway approach language to match current and past practices of funding work; and updates the way curb is funded the following the creation of the sidewalk utility. Amendments to Chapter 345-10 remove the requirement that owners repair sidewalk since this work is now covered by the sidewalk utility.

**Ordinance 23-14:** Section 334-8 allows refuse, either inside a tote or a large item outside a tote, to be placed at the curb 24 hours before collection as opposed to limiting it to 12 hours before collection.

**Ordinance 26-16:** Section 305-42 Truancy provides the maximum amount of the forfeiture for truants and habitual truants that match the statutes.

**Ordinance 23-19:** Deletes the chapter 352 on taxi cab licensing as it is obsolete primarily due to the advent of ride sharing.

**Ordinance 23-20:** Updates the ordinance and resolution section to remove the requirement that ordinances be read out loud.

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EDGERTON, ROCK AND DANE COUNTIES, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Chapter 334, Section 334-8 shall read as follows:

**§ 334-8 Placement of refuse at curb.**

No refuse other than brush and leaves shall be placed between the sidewalk and the curb or at any place in a residential section in said City for collection more than 42 24 hours before the day of collection, and no basket, box or other container for such refuse shall remain between the sidewalk and the curb or at any other place in a residential section in said City for collection for more than 12 hours after the time of collection.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and publication.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 55 FINANCE AND TAXATION, SECTION 55-20  
SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS AND CHAPTER 345 STREETS AND WALKS, SECTIONS 345-10  
CONSTRUCTION IN THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF EDGERTON ROCK AND  
DANE COUNTIES, WISCONSIN.

Alderperson introduced the following Ordinance and moved its adoption:

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EDGERTON, ROCK AND DANE COUNTIES,  
WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Chapter 55 section 55-20 shall read as follows:

§ 55-20 **Special Assessments.**

E. Determination of assessment cost for new street construction.

(1) The assessment for the initial installation of street, ~~curb, gutter~~ and pavement construction (see elsewhere in this code for repair, reconstruction, replacement or widening assessment methods) shall be computed by multiplying the adjusted front footage, as provided in subsection (3)(a) of this section, by the base charge per foot, as provided in subsection (3)(b) of this section, as established from time to time by the Common Council. The assessment for the initial installation of curb and gutter shall be calculated as described above for streets except that 50% of the cost of initial installation of curb and gutter will be paid by the Stormwater Utility. Said assessment shall apply to residential, business and industrial property.

G. Drive approach construction.

(1) Residential, business and industrial drive approaches. Driveway approaches being constructed or reconstructed must meet the grade and construction requirements set forth by the Public Works Director and/or the City Engineer.

(2) New construction and reconstruction of drive approaches will be paid for as follows ~~100% by the property owner.~~

(a) ~~The~~ When roadwork work is to will be done by a city issued contract, totally by the contractor awarded the contract by the City if the drive approach and the sidewalk area of the approach is being constructed along with roadwork initiated by the City. The replacement cost of the approach and the sidewalk area of the approach will be 100% paid for by the City. ~~assessed to the property owner.~~

(b) ~~The work~~ New or reconstructed approaches can be contracted by the property owner as long as the City does not have plans for street repairs that would affect the drive approach. In which either case the property owner is responsible for 100% of the costs of the approach.

(c) When work is to be done on a drive approach that is contracted by the property owner and it involves the sidewalk area of the approach, the property owner is responsible for 100% of the sidewalk work abutting the approach.

H. Sidewalks, new construction and reconstruction.

- (1) Except as provided in Subsection **H(7)**, the City does not require sidewalks on all paralleling City streets unless, the City Council deems necessary a sidewalk for public safety and/or public convenience. All sidewalks constructed or reconstructed within the City limits must meet the grade and construction requirements set forth by the Public Works Director and City Engineer.
- (2) Sidewalks currently existing in the City shall not be permitted to be removed by the abutting property owner.
- (3) The cost of new and the reconstruction of City sidewalk will be paid for in accordance with Chapter 366 Article IV by the person whose property abuts an existing sidewalk with the following exceptions:

~~(a) The cost of repairing sidewalk along the frontage of the streets listed below shall be divided evenly between the City and the property owner if the sidewalk is wider than six feet: Fulton Street (north side) between Catlin Street and Albion Street also including 312 West Fulton Street for that portion that is constructed curb to building; Fulton Street (south side) between Catlin Street and 2 Burdick Street including 2 Burdick Street; Burdick Street at 2 Burdick Street; Main Street (west side) between Canal Street and 202 South Main Street including 202 South Main Street; Main Street (east side) between Rollin Street and West Lawton Street; Canal Street (south side) lot six, block 11 of Swift's Addition; Henry Street (east side) between West Fulton Street and Canal Street, and 115 and 121 Henry Street; Henry Street (west side) between West Fulton Street and 114 Henry Street; Swift Street (east side) between West Fulton Street and 101 Swift Street; Swift Street (west side) between West Fulton Street and 16 Swift Street.~~

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Chapter 345 section 345-10 shall read as follows:

**§ 345-10 Owner to Construction.**

**A.** ~~The owner of the abutting land shall have the duty to repair, construct and perpetually maintain sidewalks in a workmanlike manner along or upon any street, alley or highway in the City of Edgerton and shall pay the entire cost thereof. Whenever the City Council shall by resolution determine that a sidewalk be laid, rebuilt, repaired, lowered or raised along or upon any public street, alley or highway within the City of Edgerton, it shall proceed according to § 66.0907, Wis. Stats., and may, among its other powers, establish the width, determine the thickness, specify the type of pavement to be used and the method of construction and these standards it sets may be different for different streets.~~

**B.** ~~Whenever any owner shall neglect, for a period of 20 days of service of notice upon him according to § 66.0907, Wis. Stats., to lay, remove, replace or repair any such sidewalk the City Council may cause such work to be done at the expense of the owner. All work for the construction of sidewalks shall be let by contract to the lowest responsible bidder except as provided by § 62.15(1), Wis. Stats.~~

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A REVISION AND CODIFICATION OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE  
CITY OF EDGERTON, WISCONSIN

Aldersperson introduced the following Ordinance and moved it adoption:

The City Council of the City of Edgerton does hereby ordain as follows:

**§ 1-8. Code adopted; existing ordinances continued.**

Pursuant to § 66.0103, Wis. Stats., the ordinances of the City of Edgerton of a general and permanent nature adopted by the City Council of the City of Edgerton, as revised and codified and consisting of Chapters 1 through 450, are hereby approved, adopted, ordained and enacted as the Code of the City of Edgerton, hereinafter referred to as the "Code." The provisions of the Code, insofar as they are substantively the same as those of the ordinances in force immediately prior to the enactment of the Code by this ordinance, are intended as a continuation of such ordinances and not as new enactments. This ordinance and the Code adopted hereby shall supersede and replace the 1993 Code of Ordinances, as amended and supplemented.

**§ 1-9. Code on file; additions and amendments.**

- A. In accordance with § 66.0103, Wis. Stats., a copy of the Code has been filed in the office of the City Clerk and made available for public inspection for not less than two weeks prior to adoption of this ordinance, and following adoption of this ordinance such copy shall be maintained and available for public inspection in the office of the City Clerk.
- B. Additions or amendments to the Code, when adopted in such form as to indicate the intent of the City Council to make them a part thereof, shall be deemed to be incorporated into such Code so that reference to the "Code of the City of Edgerton" shall be understood and intended to include such additions and amendments.

**§ 1-10. Notice; publication.**

The Clerk of the City of Edgerton shall cause notice of the passage of this ordinance to be given in the manner required by law. The notice of passage of this ordinance coupled with the filing of the Code in the office of the City Clerk as provided in § 1-9 shall be deemed, held and considered to be due and legal publication of all provisions of the Code for all purposes.

**§ 1-11. Severability.**

Each section of this ordinance and of the Code and every part of each section is an independent section or part of a section, and the holding of any section or a part thereof to be unconstitutional, void or ineffective for any cause shall not be deemed to affect the validity or constitutionality of any other sections or parts thereof. If any provision of this Code or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this Code and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

**§ 1-12. Repealer.**

- A. Ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions contained in the Code adopted by this ordinance are hereby repealed; provided, however, that such repeal shall only be to the extent of such inconsistency, and any valid legislation of the City of Edgerton which is not in conflict with the provisions of the Code shall be deemed to remain in full force and effect.
- B. The following have been excluded from the Code and are specifically repealed:
  - (1) Chapter 25, Edgerton Cable Television Franchise, of the 1993 Code of Ordinances.
  - (2) Section 18.25, Spitting on sidewalks and walls, of the 1993 Code of Ordinances.
  - (3) Section 19.01, Amusements, of the 1993 Code of Ordinances.
  - (4) Sections 19.03, 19.07 and 19.08, Bowling Alleys, Billiard and Pool Halls; Shuffleboard Tables; Roller Skating Rinks; Theaters, of the 1993 Code of Ordinances.
  - (5) Section 19.04, Dance and Dance Halls, of the 1993 Code of Ordinances.
  - (6) Section 19.14, Private Commercial Parking Lots, of the 1993 Code of Ordinances.
  - (7) Section 19.15, Trap shoots license, of the 1993 Code of Ordinances.

**§ 1-13. Ordinances saved from repeal.**

The adoption of this Code and the repeal of ordinances provided for in § 1-12 of this ordinance shall not affect the following ordinances, rights and obligations, which are hereby expressly saved from repeal:

- A. Any ordinance adopted subsequent to February 6, 2023.
- B. Any right or liability established, accrued or incurred under any legislative provision prior to the effective date of this ordinance or any action or proceeding brought for the enforcement of such right or liability.
- C. Any offense or act committed or done before the effective date of this ordinance in violation of any legislative provision or any penalty, punishment or forfeiture which may result therefrom.
- D. Any prosecution, indictment, action, suit or other proceeding pending or any judgment rendered prior to the effective date of this ordinance brought pursuant to any legislative provision.
- E. Any franchise, license, right, easement or privilege heretofore granted or conferred.
- F. Any ordinance providing for the laying out, opening, altering, widening, relocating, straightening, establishing grade, naming, improvement, acceptance or vacation of any right-of-way, easement, street, road, highway, park or other public place or any portion thereof.
- G. Any ordinance appropriating money or transferring funds, promising or guaranteeing the payment of money or authorizing the issuance and delivery of any bond or other instruments or evidence of the City's indebtedness.

- H. Ordinances authorizing the purchase, sale, lease or transfer of property or any lawful contract or obligation.
- I. The levy or imposition of taxes, assessments or charges.
- J. The annexation or dedication of property or approval of preliminary or final subdivision plats.
- K. Ordinances providing for local improvements or assessing taxes or special assessments therefor.
- L. All currently effective ordinances pertaining to the rate and manner of payment of salaries and compensation of officers and employees.
- M. Any legislation relating to or establishing a pension plan or pension fund for municipal employees.
- N. Any ordinances adopting or amending the Zoning Map or otherwise rezoning property.
- O. Any charter ordinances.
- P. Any ordinance or portion of an ordinance establishing or amending a specific fee amount for any license, permit or service obtained from the City.
- Q. Any ordinance or portion of an ordinance establishing or amending a deposit or bond schedule.
- R. Any ordinance or portion of an ordinance establishing or amending rates or charges for water or sewer service.

**§ 1-14. Changes in previously adopted ordinances; new ordinances.**

- A. In preparing the revision and codification of the ordinances, certain minor grammatical and nonsubstantive changes were made in one or more of said ordinances, and references to state statutes and regulations were updated to reflect the numbering and titles of the statutes and regulations as of the publication of this Code. It is the intention of the City Council that all such changes be adopted as part of the Code as if the ordinances so changed had been formally amended to read as such.
- B. In accordance with § 66.0103, Wis. Stats., the Code of the City of Edgerton, on file in the office of the City Clerk, is adopted and incorporated by reference, including the revisions set forth in Schedule A attached hereto and made a part hereof. (Chapter and section number references in Schedule A are to the ordinances as they have been renumbered and appear in the Code.)

**§ 1-15. Titles and headings; editor's notes.**

- A. Chapter and article titles, headings and titles of sections and other divisions of the Code are inserted in the Code and may be inserted in supplements to the Code for the convenience of persons using the Code and are not part of the legislation.
- B. Editor's notes indicating sources of sections, giving other information or referring to the statutes or to other parts of the Code are inserted in the Code and may be inserted in supplements to the Code for the convenience of persons using the Code and are not part of the legislation.

**§ 1-16. Altering or tampering with Code; violations and penalties.**

It shall be unlawful for anyone to change, alter or tamper with the Code in any manner which will cause the laws of the City of Edgerton to be misrepresented thereby. Anyone violating this section shall be subject, upon conviction, to a penalty as provided in § 1-6 of the Code.

**§ 1-17. When effective.**

This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication or posting as provided by law.

Description: A detached private garage or carport is a structure that primarily accommodates the sheltered parking of a passenger vehicle. A utility/storage shed is an accessory structure that accommodates the storage of residential maintenance equipment and shall not be used to store cars, trucks or related non-recreational vehicles. A playhouse is an accessory structure that is intended for use as a small recreational structure. A gazebo is an accessory structure intended for use as a temporary shelter. These structures must be located so as to be accessory to a principal land use on the same or adjacent lot. If located on an adjacent lot, the owner must record a deed restriction prohibiting the sale of the two parcels separately. A polystructure is not: a garage; a carport if it is attached to another structure; a utility shed; a playhouse; or a gazebo.

Sewer and water service may be installed to serve a Detached Private Garage, Carport or Utility/Storage Shed under the following conditions: there is no the structure a toilet or shower installed, except for an exterior shower in conjunction with a swimming pool; the structure must have a garage door and a driveway; and the petitioner must file a deed restriction stating that the garage cannot be used as either living quarters or in the operation a business unless local land use permits are obtained and all building, local, and state codes are met. The deed restriction must be filed before a building permit is issued.

After such first reading every ordinance, or resolution in the nature of an ordinance, shall lay over until the next regular meeting of the Council, when it shall be read a second time, unless however the Council may shall suspend its rules by a two-thirds vote of its members and allow action on the matter order a second reading thereof at the same meeting such ordinance, or resolution in the nature of an ordinance, was read the first presented. time. On such second reading it shall be sufficient to have such ordinance, or resolution in the nature of an ordinance, read by title only, unless otherwise requested by some member of the Council.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and publication.
