Lead Lateral Replacement Program Bids: The City received 4 bids for the "private side" lead lateral replacement program ranging from \$128,778-\$310,252. The low bid was from KS Energy, LLC for \$128,778.

This work is being paid for by a DNR grant.

Application for a Facade Grant for 106 W Fulton St: The owner of 106 W Fulton Street (Richard Borys) is requesting approval of a façade grant to tuck point his building. Of the three bids, the owner wishes to take the highest bid. His reasoning is below. The low bid for the project is \$10,680 for which the maximum grant is \$4,272. The bid the applicant wishes to take is for \$12,600 for which the maximum grant would be \$5,000.

"I am planning to use the Raynor Tuckpointing from Chicago. There price is the highest but I know there work. They have excellent reputation, do very esthetically pleasing work and the difference is not that great. I rather have it done right the first time. In the past someone did the tuck pointing of my building but only on the upper part of the facade and the mortar foaled off. I would like the facade to look uniformly and last."

Pool Wages: The current wage cap on pool wages is \$12.00. With the increase in the wage scale, the Director is requesting the cap be increased to \$13.00.

Part time police patrol position: The Personnel Policy Manual requires the Council approve the creation of new positions. The City has not had a part-time police patrol officer for several years. The Personnel Committee has recommended the reestablishment of a part-time patrol officer position.

The reasons for the request are:

- The Commission expressed interest in hiring this candidate during the last interview process but decided to offer the position to another candidate. The last interview process had a very limited number of candidates so the Commission has a heightened interest in attracting good candidates in a limited field.
- Having the candidate employed as a part-time officer would improve the chances of being able to hire the candidate when an anticipated vacancy occurs early next year.
- If the part-time employee were hired to fill a full-time vacancy, the training period would be shorter thus potentially saving costs.
- The department and the candidate would be able to assess compatibility.

- The candidate would benefit by having access to the police academy and, as an employee of a department, the state would reimburse the candidate for the cost of the academy.
- Overall, it is anticipated that having the part-time officer will increase costs in the short term but in some cases having the part-time officer may reduce overtime costs.

Provisions of the union contract applying to the part-time patrol are:

- No benefits (WRS rules would require retirement benefits if the employee exceed 1,200 hours in a year. The employee would not work that many hours.)
- Part-time employees can take posted OT (shift vacancy) only after the OT has been offered to full time employees.
- Part-time officers are eligible for the first 4 steps of the contract pay scale. This employee would start at the start wage.

Parking Ordinance: The attached parking ordinance provides a reference in the Parking Restriction chapter of the ordinance to the parking provisions in 22.404 (7) (e) and 22.215(2) that prohibit parking in a front lawn or terrace.

CITY OF EDGERTON ORDINANCE No. 21-06

A CHARTER ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 2.02 ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE EDGERTON CODE OF GENERAL ORDINANCES, CITY OF EDGERTON ROCK AND DANE COUNTIES, WISCONSIN

Alderperson Casey Langan introduced the following Charter Ordinance and moved its adoption:

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EDGERTON, ROCK AND DANE COUNTIES, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS

Section 2.02 (1) and (2) shall be amended as follows:

(1) MAYOR AND ALDERPERSONS.

- (a) ELECTION AND TERM. The Mayor shall be elected in even-numbered years for a term of 2 3 years. Two aldermen shall be elected from each aldermanic district, with 1 from each district to be elected each year for a term of 2 years. Such terms shall commence as provided by law.
- **(b) SALARIES.** The annual salary paid to the Mayor and alderpersons shall be determined by resolution.

(2) MUNICIPAL JUDGE.

Seconded by Alderperson: Jim Burdick

(a) ELECTION AND TERM. The Municipal Judge shall be elected in even-numbered years for a term of 2.4 years as provided in Chapter 6 of this Municipal Code.

22.404 OFF-Street Parking and Traffic Circulation Standards

- (e) Locational Prohibitions for Off-Street Parking Areas.
 - (a) Off-street parking shall not be located between the principal structure on a residential lot and a street right-of-way, except within residential driveways and parking lots designated on the approved site plan (see Subsection 22.213).
 - **(b)** No private **parking** shall occur on street terraces, driveways, or any other areas located within a public right-of-way not explicitly designated by the Director of Public Works.
- (f) Commercial and Industrial Vehicle and Equipment Parking: Parking spaces clearly visible from public streets shall only be used for customer or employee vehicles. No commercial and industrial vehicle shall be parked in required off street parking spaces unless such spaces are designate for business use on a City approved site plan. This restriction shall also prevent non- employee or customer trailer parking in required off street parking spaces.
