Closed Circuit Traffic Monitoring Cameras

As we move into the summer months, it is wise to plan for the inevitable summer storm. We tend to breathe a sigh of relief after a storm moves on. However, just because the storm has passed, it does not mean that the danger has. There could be a variety of hazards left behind. Keep these tips in mind:

Safety after the Storm

- Do not touch a downed line or something that has fallen over, like a fence or tree limb. A downed power line does not have to be arcing or smoking to be deadly. Stay away, and instruct others to do the same. If you come across downed power lines, call 911 and your power company immediately.
- If you are inspecting your home in the dark, use a flashlight rather than a candle to avoid risk of fire or explosion due to a gas leak.
- Never enter a flooded basement if electrical outlets are under water. The water could be energized.
- Do not turn power off if you must stand in the water to do so. Call your power company to have the power turned off at the meter.

Many storms result in power outages. One way to deal with an outage is by using a generator. Generators can help you get by until the power company restores your power, but operating your generator safely is crucial. Keep these tips in mind when you are operating your generator:

- Read and follow manufacturer operating instructions to properly ground the generator.
- To prevent back feed, standby generators should have a transfer switch installed by a professional. Also portable generators should never be plugged directly into a home outlet or electrical system – use an extension cord to plug appliances into an outlet on the generator to power them.
- Nothing should be plugged into a generator when you turn it on. This prevents a surge from damaging the generator and appliances.
- Generators pose electrical risks, especially when operated in wet conditions. Use a generator only when necessary if the weather creates wet conditions. Protect the generator by operating it under an open, canopy-like structure and on a dry surface where water cannot form puddles. Always insure your hands are dry before touching the generator. Highway 51 through the City of Edgerton is currently a designated alternative route for the I-39/90 reconstruction project. An important component to monitoring traffic flow along the alternate route is a closed circuit camera system (CCTV). The CCTV will provide the ability to oversee areas of potential congestion and provide fast and appropriate response if an issue arises.

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (DOT) plans to install two CCTV cameras at the intersection of highways 51 and 59 because it is an area of concern along the alternate route. The CCTVs can provide video surveillance to monitor traffic flow and to identify backups along each approach to the intersection. Video images are fed to the traffic operations center to assist operators in placing messages on variable message signs. This data is then utilized to notify motorists of delay times on the message boards along the interstate and to provide better information to emergency services providers. When an incident occurs, the images can help operators determine if a modification of ramp meter timing should be made to avoid secondary crashes and to reduce congestion in that area. Swift Street Storm Sewer Repair

If you attempted travel on Rollin Street near the Swift Street intersection during the past few weeks, you may have noticed a construction project. This project entails the reconstruction of a portion of the Swift Street storm sewer. This storm sewer is not a normal one because it happens to be one of the largest and oldest in Edgerton. What is especially unique about this storm sewer is its rectangular shape and the fact that its top serves as the Swift Street sidewalk on the east side as it heads into Central Park. The pipe begins at the fish pond on West Lawton Street and runs to Sauder's Creek in Central Park. This essential piece of infrastructure is the only outlet for storm water for the southwest quarter of the entire city.

This repair will improve a section of pipe that was failing and also allow for the installation of accessibility ramps at the intersection, which were not feasible until now.
