# Absentee Voting- Request Ballot by mail, email or fax:

When : Absentee voting is open from now until the deadline listed below.

Where: Edgerton City Hall, 12 Albion Street

**Deadline:** Applications to receive a ballot must be received in the Clerk's office by 5:00 pm Thursday, November 3, 2016. Submit a completed Absentee Ballot application request form and a copy of your photo ID. The completed absentee ballot must be delivered no later than 8:00pm on Election Day.

#### PUBLIC WORKS NOTICES

#### **Brush Pickup**

Brush pickup is scheduled for the first Tuesday of the month through November, weather permitting. Limbs and branches should be bundled or put in garbage cans. Bundles should be no

larger than 6 feet long and 24 inches in diameter. Garbage cans should not exceed 100 pounds. Residents may bring bushes, tree limbs and other brush to the city owned dump site located in the back of the Fassett Cemetery. #### Compost

If you are looking for a place to dispose of leaves, twigs and garden debris, there is a compost pile located at the City Garage.



#### Leaf Pickup

Leaf pickup is scheduled to begin the week of October 24th. Please place your leaves

in the street along the curb. You can assist us in making leaf collection as quick as possible by not parking too close to the leaf piles and by making the piles as consolidated as possible. Please remember burning is not allowed in the City.

#### **Cemetery Flowers & Plants**

All winter flowers and hanging baskets must be removed by November 1st of each year or they will be removed and disposed of by cemetery personnel. Holiday flowers can be placed on or after November 11.

#### Winter Parking Rules

Winter snow parking regulations will go into effect on November 1, 2016. Parking is not allowed on any street or highway after a snowfall until snow is plowed back to the curb. Overnight parking in parking lots is restricted to the rear of the lots during any snowfall as posted in all lots. Parking on unplowed streets will result in a fine of \$50.00.



#### Sidewalks

Please have your sidewalks cleared from edge to edge of all snow and ice no later than 24 hours after a snowfall. Failure to clear walks in the appropriate time may result in a fine of \$25.00-\$200.00.

#### **Snow Plowing**

It is against city ordinance to plow snow from your personal driveway, sidewalk, or parking area into public streets or alleys. If necessary the City will remove the snow that was put in the public street and the cost of the snow removal will be charged to the property owner in addition to a potential fine of \$25-\$200.

## \$20,000 of Savings ... Each Year ... for 40 years

Just like for home mortages, the impact of an interest rate reduction has the effect of lowering a mortgage payment. This is what has happened for the Sewer Utility. The utility has recently learned that its USDA Rural Development loan will be issued at a lower percentage rate than originally planned: 1.875% instead of 2.25%. This interest rate reduction will lower debt payments by approximately \$20,000 per year for 40 years. These savings will help the Utility Commission to achieve its long term goal of upgrading the wastewater treatment plant without requiring a significant rate increase to customers.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Project Reaches Milestone

At the end of September, the wastewater treatment plant project reached an important milestone - the method used to treat wastewater was switched from the old process to the new one. During this first phase of construction, the challenge was to build the new plant around the still-operating old one, while still meeting DNR treatment criteria. This feat tested the skills of the engineers, contractors, and plant operators. While the new treatment process is now up and running, there are still many months of construction ahead - obsolete facilities have to be razed or converted to other uses, and acres of land have to be reshaped to accommodate the new facilities.



## **Dog Park Open**

October 1st was the grand opening of Edgerton's new dog park. This first fenced dog park is located on Winston Drive on the city's west side. The park was made possible by many generous donations and also by the efforts of the Public Works Department, installing such improvements as a repurposed fence from Racetrack Park. The Parks Committee and City Council are hopeful this added feature to the community will be an opportunity to bring people and dogs together to make an even better Edgerton. Please enjoy the park and be respectful of the operating policies so that everyone can enjoy a run in the park.



### **2017** Construction – Blaine Street Water Main

In the summer of 2017, the Edgerton Water Utility will reconstruct the water main in Blaine Street, from Randolph Street to Hemphill Avenue. The project will involve (1) water main replacement, (2) water and sewer lateral replacement, (3) sidewalk repair, and (4) street resurfacing. While the street will remain open to local traffic throughout the project, residents should expect occasional driveway access limitations and water service interruptions. Additional information will be provided as the start date approaches.
